**Common Noun**

**CHAPTER-1-Living and non living things**

**Introduction-** Things around us can be categorised into two groups-**living things** and **non-living things**. **Living things-** Things that have life in them are called living things. All **living things** can breathe, eat, grow, move, reproduce and have senses. **Examples** of living things are human beings, animals, birds **Non –living things** –Things that do not have life in them are called non-living things. **Non living-things** do not eat, grow, breathe, move and reproduce. **Examples** of non-living things **are** book, pen, train, rope.

**Characteristics of living things:**

- 1) **Living things grow**-All living things grow with time using the energy they get from food. Human and animal babies slowly grow into adults.
- 2) **Living things move**-All living things show movement. Human can walk, run, jump etc. To move birds fly, dogs and cats walk and run to move.
- 3) **Living things need food**- All living things need food to live and grow. They get energy from food.
- 4) **Living things reproduce**-All living things can reproduce. Examples- Bird lays eggs and babies hatch out from the eggs.
- 5) **Living things breathe**- All living things inhale oxygen from air and give out carbon-dioxide to air.
- 6) **Living things excrete wastes**—All living things excrete wastes .In humans, waste is also excreted through skin.

**CHAPTER-2 Human body**

**At a Glance:**

**Our body** is made of different parts that work together to help us carry out our bodily activities. These parts are called organ. Our body consists of internal and external organs. Brain, heart, lungs, liver, stomach, intestines and kidneys are the internal organs of the body. Brain controls all the functions of our body. Eyes, nose, hands, legs, skin etc. are the external organs.

- A human body has several organ systems that work together to keep it functioning. The group of organs are called together organ system.
- Nose, windpipe and lungs are the organs of the respiratory system.

**Mechanism of Breathing :** Breathing is the process of taking in oxygen into lungs and giving out carbon dioxide. As we breathe in and out, a special organ called diaphragm moved up and down below the lungs. The diaphragm helps our lungs to expand and contract while we inhale and exhale, respectively

- Deep breathing is a type of Pranayama.
- Air pollution makes the air impure and unsafe for breathing. It affects the health of all living things.
